APL Sends Storm Crews to Help with Hurricane Irene Recovery in Northeast

Chattanooga, TN: Lee Robertson, President of APL Power Services, announced that the company deployed nine storm crews to the northeast to assist with the massive power outages caused by Hurricane Irene.

On August 26th APL sent crews to restore power across the Northeast responding first to the call from CVPS (Central Vermont Public Service). When work was completed with CVPS, the APL crews headed to work for Vermont Electric Cooperative restoring power to many in need. APL also had crews working for PSNAH (Public Service New Hampshire) and then responded to the call of 750,000 outages for CLP (Connecticut Light & Power). Over 500 crews from contractors and power companies across the county responded to this call. The APL Crews then traveled to both Danielson and Canterbury Connecticut to restore power to those in need. Upon completion of their work in the northeast, the crews were headed home when the call came in from EPB (Electric Power Board) in Tennessee to help restore power to over 25,000 outages throughout their service area.



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
